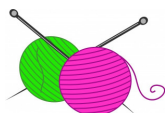


Cactus Needles News...

ANNA CLIFTON HAS A BUCKET LIST

“We only have so much time on this earth,” she believes, “so I have a list of things I want to do while I’m here.”

Her list started while she was vacationing in the Caribbean and decided she wanted to try parasailing. Her first challenge was to convince her husband, Boomer, to accompany her – no small task, since Boomer doesn’t like anything taller than the loft of a barn. However, after much prodding, they both took off. Anna was enchanted. “It was the most exhilarating thing I’d ever done and I didn’t want it to end!” she remembers.

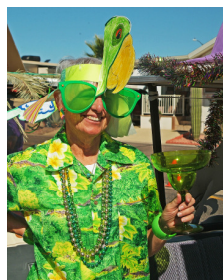
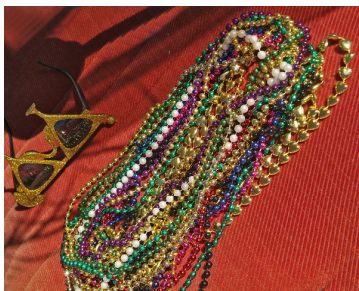
Because she enjoyed parasailing so much, Boomer bought her a ride in a glider. Anna sat in the front seat of the plane with the pilot in the rear. She actually pulled the cord which separated the glider from the tow plane. Using the rudders and steering mechanism, she piloted the glider as it rode the updrafts for a 45-minute ride over the Arizona desert. “What I remember most,” she recalls, “is the silence as we soared along.”

Following her glider experience and disregarding the advice of friends that only a fool jumps out of a perfectly good airplane, Anna signed up at Sky Dive Arizona at the Eloy Airport. She was told that her first jump would be a controlled buddy jump, fastened to her instructor in a spoon-like position. When Anna looked over the instructors available, she thought she had wandered into a lineup for a biker bar – long-haired, torn jeans, scruffy beards. But after talking to a few of the young men, she picked one who turned out to have made more than 4000 jumps.

Clothed appropriately, Anna and the instructor climbed into the plane and half an hour later were at 12,500 feet. Anna and her buddy fastened themselves together, and her instructor gave her a thumbs up as they leaped out of the plane. Anna was in charge of pulling the rip cords. What she remembers most was the wind pulling the skin on her face back toward her ears. At the appropriate time she pulled the cords, felt the upward jerk as the chute opened, then watched fascinated as the ground slowly came up to meet them. The landing was efficient if not graceful – sliding to a stop on their rear ends!

What’s next for Anna on her list? “I plan to zip line this summer, and I’d like to try hang gliding. There is a perfect spot for this in the Big Horn Mountains of Wyoming where you glide down into the little town of Buffalo.” How about a ride in a hot air balloon? “Already done that with my brother-in-law,” Anna confided.

When she wasn’t crossing items off her bucket list, Anna and Boomer managed their farm near Powell, Wyoming. They recently sold most of their acreage, keeping the Clifton family farmhouse and 5 acres for their personal garden. Anna also spends a lot of time with granddaughters Juju and Dulce, aged 3. She also works as an interpreter at the Heart Mountain Interpretive Center, one of 10 Japanese internment camps from World War II.
